The Delaware-Maryland 4R Alliance provides a framework for 4R stakeholders to work together and meet the economic, environmental and social needs of Delmarva's agricultural community. While each member will define their individual contributions according to their role and capacity, all DE-MD 4R Alliance members have two responsibilities:

- Conduct 4R outreach in your community. This can include helping to sponsor, host or participate in field days, hosting field demonstrations, writing or contributing to timely articles on 4R practices or success stories or presenting at seminars or workshops.
- Help farmers get credit for their 4R Nutrient Stewardship. This can include sharing success stories, helping to track and report practice adoption to demonstrate the effectiveness of voluntary conservation in a way that respects your and your farmers' confidentiality.
